Colin Durante receives APWA Presidential Leadership Award

Colin Durante, President, Pavement Technology, Inc., (PTI) Westlake, Ohio, received the Presidential Leadership Award from APWA. This award is presented to members who have distinguished themselves and the public works profession with their leadership.



Durante has been affiliated with public works his entire life. In 1971 he learned of a process that could allow local governments and their public works departments to inexpensively improve the overall condition of the roadway pavements by greatly extending the life of the pavement surfaces. In 1972 he and his father established a company named Pavement Technology, Inc. in Westlake, Ohio. Durante was excited how this process could help any public works department and began visiting cities and towns in northeastern Ohio to explain and promote the process.

Durante's idea worked very well, and his company is now in its 46th year. During these years he became involved with APWA on the state chapter level and became an annual vendor at the APWA national conferences. He understood the value of how APWA was helping to promote education and professionalism for public works employees and departments across the nation. He became more involved in the state chapters of those states where his company was doing business.

During the past 25 years PTI has been a strong supporter and sponsor of many chapter activities and has had a presence at chapter conferences in Ohio, Tennessee, Kentucky, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Florida and other states. He has encouraged and supported many of his staff members as they served on committees or became officers in state chapters in Ohio, Tennessee and Florida.

Workshop Re-caps

The Southwest Branch is hosting a variety of workshops this year. Here is a summary of some of them.

OKI Construction Career Days

The Southwest Branch participated at the OKI Construction Career Days September 19-20. CCD is coordinated by the Allied Construction Industries. The mission of the "Construction Career Days" is to improve the image of the construction industry in the eyes of today's middle and high school students and plant the seeds for tomorrow's skilled workforce. 2,000 middle school and high school students from the tristate area (Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana) attended over two days. The students came from both urban and suburban school districts. This year our branch had a large space in the field to display PW equipment like a snow plow, vactor truck, bucket truck, sewer tv truck, and mowing machine. Operators explained how the equipment was used, and helped the students safely explore each piece.



We spoke to the students to explain public works and the career openings available, many of which provide a good living without requiring a four-year degree. We gave them handouts, pens, and our business card. The card included a QR code to connect with APWA's "I Am Public Works" video on YouTube. We plan to continue participating in Construction Career Days as a great outreach opportunity.



Calibration Cruise-In

The Montgomery County Engineers Office hosted a Calibration Cruise-In on September 27 for Southwest Ohio. Vendor representatives from Certified Power, Force America, Muncie Power, Pengwyn, and Rexroth showed the people attending the correct way to calibrate their salt spreader. From determining how much salt comes through the augurs, to what the screens in the cab are telling the driver, it was the complete experience.



Agencies from Cincinnati, Dayton, Dublin, Huber Heights, Middletown, Amberley Village, Butler Township, Springdale, West Chester, Forest Park, Mason, Montgomery County, Beavercreek, and Blue Ash learned more about their own systems, and discussed pros and cons about the different configurations. They will be saving tax payer funds and will be more effective when fighting ice and snow this winter. These Focus Reports enabled the exempt employees with the assistance of all bargaining unit employees a total of 450) to meet or exceed all 64 Organizational Performance Index Goals.
